Superintendent Joe Macary

Superintendent Macary joined us as we reviewed recent projects and plans for 2017. The organizations discussed areas where they are working with students and schools:

• Friends of HRLP can use student volunteers when they install the Suspended Bridge over the Hockanum River in the Spring.

• Friends of Valley Falls has opportunities for student docents when the farm is open to visitors in the summer.

• Strong Family Farm's next opportunity for student volunteers is likely the spring cleanup day in April. Nancy is on the VoAg Board so there are many ways students can help at the farm.

• The Vernon Chorale discussed a plan for selecting a High School Fellow.

• **Tolland County Agricultural Center** hosts many 4-H activities and with the new Gunther Farm can use volunteer help developing that property. They also give two scholarships.

• Vernon Education Foundation gives grants to teachers each year and encourages more to submit proposals.

• Vernon Garden Club gives a grant each year and works with Lake Street students on their butterfly garden. They would like to reach other schools with garden projects.

• Vernon Historical Society's Jean Luddy is working with the Curriculum Committee on updating "Vernon, Our Town" for third grade students.

Mr. Macary invited us to participate in a new email newsletter program sent to every student's family. Send him a pdf flyer for upcoming events and he'll see that its included with the mailing. This is an opportunity for us to reach more families with programs at no cost to you.

Other Organization Updates & News

• Friends of HRLP has a \$175,000 grant and is working with VGV on a Suspended Bridge over the Hockanum River north of Route 74 connecting the Dart Hill North Trail to Ellington's part of the Hockanum River Trail. Work has been delayed until Spring.

• Friends of Rockville Public Library has many fall events including a cookie sale, tag sale and games.

• Friends of Valley Falls is working with Bob Hurd on changes to the Stable to accommodate visitors to their planned Heritage Center.

• Strong Family Farm had a very successful Fall Harvest Festival. Many exhibitors and a good opportunity for our organizations to reach the public. 2017 is the 100th anniversary of the barn.

• The Vernon Chorale's first concert is December 10 at St. John's Episcopal Church.

• Tolland County Agricultural Center is making good progress on the acquisition of the Gunther Farm.

- Vernon Education Foundation gave mini grants to teachers.
- Vernon Garden Club's 2016-2017 season is underway with monthly programs.

• Vernon Historical Society held its 50th Anniversary celebration in October. They are finalizing program plans for 2017.

• The Greater Vernon Holistic Healthfest is March 25 & 26 at VCMS. Some of our outdoor groups have been taking part. Michelle Hill from the Vernon Youth Services Bureau is the organizer.

• In October I attended a CT League of Historical Organizations Marketing Program. Not too much new but they encouraged adding a Twitter account to reach younger people. I'm considering this and have also started a Blog, mostly for the Tankerhoosen, but will include VVC activities where possible.
